BACKGROUND

Challenges Faced

- · Inefficient picking and loading processes leading to delays
- Poor inventory visibility resulting in stockouts and overage products
- Lack of auditing procedures leading to inaccurate loading and receiving
- Lack of quality handling procedures leading to increased product damage

SOLUTIONS IMPLEMENTED

Base + Pay Model Implementation

- Pay Model:
 - Employees Paid on Base + Commission basis
 - \$100 for each day worked
 - \$20 per truck loaded
 - \$10 per truck loaded
 - \$.06 per case picked

Process Optimization

- Revamped Audit Process:
 - Supervisor and forklift operator review all product codes and quantities going on truck
- Receiving Quality Standards:
 - 360 walk around on all pallets received
- Operational Work Diagnostics on SOP's:
 - Reviewing SOP's with operators, when mistake is found in process retrain or improve SOP

OUTCOMES ACHIEVED

Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)

- Cycle Time: 35% Improvement
 - Prior Year 2.19 hours vs TBL8's First Year 1.42 hours
 - In transit Damage: 74% Improvement • Prior Year 2.63% vs TBL8's First Year 0.66%
- Throughput: 30% Improvement
 Prior Year 71.56% vs TBL8's First Year 92.90%
- Shipment Accuracy: 95% reduction in misshipments
 Prior Year 87.06% vs TBL8's First Year 99.42%
- Volume: 37% Increase
